Dim Fresnel



What the poly says...goes

(Editors' note: the following is a proposed addendum to "Campaigning Tips", a pamphlet distributed to all candidates prior to GM Week)

There are many ways to gain campus-wide exposure. Posters are most popular, although WRPI radio spots, appearances at GM Week events, and the famed RPI/Sage gossip network are also quite effective. There is only one way, however, to win a GM or PU election. This is through the Polytechnic.

Every candidate gets to answer written questions in the Poly; in addition the Poly interviews certain candidates and reports these also - this makes for 3 - 4 pages of closely-written text in the Poly GM Week issue. Inquisitive concerned students read these pages carefully in order to make an informed decision when voting. The other 90% of the students turn directly to the endorsements.

These endorsements are key, for they reach virtually every voting member of the student body. The GM/PU debates compete with other GM Week events; needless to say, attendance is low. Your posters and leaflets look just like the million other posters and leaflets littering campus during the Week. Not one in 100 students care to talk issues with you during GM Week parties - not when the band is blasting and the beer is freely flowing. But the Poly endorsements are well-read, for it is here the dirty laundry is aired and Poly (All-American, remember) recommendations

How important is a Polytechnic endorsement to a GM or PU candidate? Since 1973, 11 of the 14 Poly-endorsed candidates were subsequently elected; in the last 5 years 6 of the 7 Poly-approved candidates won their elections. Now, you might have to compromise a little to gain the Editorial Board's favor, perhaps overlook the thousand dollar "Poly Personal" slush fund. Is it coincidence the Poly has the largest suite of offices in the Union of any club, that they


