

## GM urges Reds to participate

Grand Field Marshal Jim "Comrade" LaPoland has put out an urgent
plea for a crackdown on campus freedom
and called for increased activity among RPI's communist population. LaPoland stated that there is simply too
much freedom on campus, too much dissention, and too little work. He implied that things will change soon, or
"drastic measures" will be taken.

Speaking before the MTV screen in the Union, LaPoland singled out the Union as the source of these problems. The Independent Student Union, formed several years ago, has, according to LaPoland, been encouraging students to "strike" from their work. LaPoland threatened several actions to counter this recent movement, including deten-

## Primary elections failed

Once again the freshman class primary elections have been held, and once again they were a complete disaster. This year a grand total of 117 votes were recorded out of the roughly 1300 freshman, for a turnout of roughly 9%. Scott Mallynumber, Senate E-

lection Ruse Chairman said he was pleased with the process but "once again nobody got around to stuffing the ballot boxes."

The poor turnout was directly at-

tributed to the candidates running for office. Between Presidential hopefuls Laurence Love-it ("I want to get the class of 1986 off its feet"), Robert

Paul Roadrunner ("The Presidency is a
Socialist position"), and Susana Selseashells ("No Comment") voters stated
that they really did not care. Roadrunner won the office by default.

## Crime Watch increases safety by bettering crime awareness

It has come to the attention of Security that a large amount of property damage and personal injury is due to poor thieving techniques and burglary blunders. To cite one example, one of the freshman dorms was recently damaged when a would-be bicycle thief sawed a telephone pole in half in an attempt to free the chained bicycle. The pole toppled through a second-story window of the dormitory, causing large amounts of damage to one room and minor damage to another. Luckily, no one was injured. The Assistant Director of Security said of the incident that, "if the thief had had a thorough understanding of chain-cutting techniques, this would never had happened."

In an effort to reverse this situation. Crime Watch is sponsoring a crime awareness seminar, in which the most recent thieving techniques will be discussed. The seminar will focus on topics ranging from advanced car theft to casualty-free arson to beginning breaking and entering, and will feature a certification by the Director of Security. Concurrently, advanced three credit-hour courses in Murderwithout-Pain, and Sensitivity and Rape will be offered through the H+SS Department. ## Institute orders new phone system

At a recent board of Trustees meeting, it was decided that RPI will soon adopt a new phone system, replacing the somewhat dated Centrex phone system currently in use. Of the three trustees who turned out for the meeting, two were in favor of installing the new system; one was opposed.

According to the new communication system plans, a telescreen will be installed in every dorm room, off-campus apartment, and fraternity bedroom, as well as in every classroom, lecture hall, and office. This system is unique in that it is only the second time the telescreen has been utilized as a full-scale mode of communication, the first time having been in Moscow.

Features: The telescreen is basically a large television screen mounted on the wall which allows the user to communicate with anyone he/she chooses, as long as the call is approved by Security. Security will have full viewing access of everyone within range of the screen, thereby drastically reducing crime here at RPI. If Security feels that a particular student's behavior is particularly dangerous to himself or others, they withold the right to take any measures that

they feel are necessary to suppress that student's actions.

In conjunction with the Phys. Ed. department. all students will be awakened at 6:35 am by the telescreen for one half hour of mandatory calisthenics. This will not only increase physical fitness, but also eliminates the possibility of oversleeping, as all screens may and will be individually monitored.

This system will be a real blessing to the RPT pocketbook. too, as it is entirely government-sponsored. The trustees mentioned during their meeting that the government expected that the government expected that the entire country will be using the free telescreen system by the year 1984.

Perhaps the Poly staff would like to see themselves plastered across their own front page? PIZZAGATE!! We would like to see it, otherwise leave the E-Board alone!


