

Who knows, with time and research, a cure may be found. Until then, if you are woken up at five in the morning, don't get mad, have pity.


Rensselaer to admit women

Today at RPI, officials announced a startling change in the admissions policy for next year. Beginning with the class of 1989, women will be considered for admission into undergraduate study programs. Ham Berg, acting president of RPI, explained, "We are an equal opportunity school educating people of every race, creed, color, and upper middle class. 
